RESTRAINING ORDER**

[PROPOSED] TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER

Upon full consideration of Plaintiff's February 29, 2016 application for a temporary restraining order and any opposition thereto,

It appearing to the Court that the Plaintiff Simratpal Singh is likely to succeed on the merits of the action, that he will suffer irreparable injury if the requested relief is not issued, that the Defendants will not be harmed if the requested relief is issued, and that the public interest favors the entry of such an order, it is, therefore,

ORDERED that Plaintiff's application for a temporary restraining order is hereby GRANTED; and it is further

ORDERED that Defendants are hereby PROHIBITED, pending further order of this Court, from subjecting Captain Singh to the protective mask test or helmet test requirements set forth in the February 23, 2016 memorandum from Debra S. Wada or any other unusual or discriminatory testing; and it is further

ORDERED that Defendants are hereby PROHIBITED, pending further order of this Court, from subjecting Captain Singh to any disciplinary measures as a result of this lawsuit or his religious beliefs; and it is further

ORDERED, in accordance with Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(c), that this injunction shall be effective immediately without security from the Plaintiff; and it is further

ORDERED, in accordance with Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(b), that this temporary restraining order shall expire fourteen days after its entry upon the docket, unless extended for good cause shown.
